The Boulder Footwash, traditionally the Saturday before Palm Sunday (a week before Easter), centers around serving the homeless in many ways, including washing their feet as Jesus did for his disciples.

This year, the Rev. Sally Bowersox and a group of volunteers from St. Benedict's Health and Healing Ministry participated in the footwashing line to screen for diabetes and other foot ailments. St. Benedict's is an outreach program of the Episcopal churches in Boulder

Doors opened at 9 a.m., and guests helped themselves to coffee, bagels and pastries donated by Panera Bread and to watch the film "The Passion of the Christ."

"It feels good to really help people," said LeHao Luu, from the Boulder Chinese Baptist Church. His youth group assisted volunteer children and guests in dyeing 10 dozen eggs.

Representatives from the Gideons International brought Bibles to share. Other books were available at a book table, and donated clothing was passed

Guests also were invited to a Bible study, followed by entertainment from Johnny Mier and his family band, then lunch.

"I enjoyed helping out," said Tamra Rowley, who volunteered to cut hair and ending up serving about 30 people.
