# Numbers, neighbors, and the name of Jesus

### The First Pres 2011 Footwash celebration

First Pres opened the doors to our homeless and marginalized neighbors Saturday, April 16, at the 17th Annual Boulder Footwash, organized by the Lamb's Ministries. The church was filled with activities and people, all celebrating the risen Lord and his love for his lambs.

In Westminster Hall, guests watched The Jesus Movie, a two-hour presentation of the life, death, and resurrection of Jesus, which has been produced in more than 1,000 languages. Coffee and sweet rolls were available along the back of the

In the courtyard, Darren Hunstad and some of his Scouts. aided by children of kitchen volunteers and other helpers, decorated and dyed more than 300 Easter eggs. These were given to guests at the meal, both as a sign of the season and a portable snack.

In the Atrium, five volunteers washed and cut hair, not to mention beards

and mustaches. Teens offered face painting, manicures, letter writing services, and about 100 washcloth bunnies to everyone who came through the room. Volunteers and guests washed one another's feet, modeling Jesus' washing His disciples' feet the night before the Crucifixion. More than 57 guests received jeans, long underwear, socks, personal toiletries, and T-shirts. Nurses from St. Benedict's provided medical advice and care, along with diabetes screening and emergency services.

Tempting odors drifted from the kitchen throughout the morning as about 30 volunteers prepared a multi-course meal. John Mier's family band sang songs and hymns of the season, as well as an inspirational message on Christ's love. Students from local schools and churches decorated about 200 placemats, and 179 guests enjoyed the hot meal at noon in Oerter Hall.
